Component concentrations in this formulation would not be expected to cause skin sensitization, based on tests of the components or similar formulations.

#### Contains:

Base oil severely refined: Not carcinogenic in animal studies. Representative material passes IP-346, Modified Ames test, and/or other screening tests. Dermal and inhalation studies showed minimal effects; lung non-specific infiltration of immune cells, oil deposition and minimal granuloma formation. Not sensitising in test animals. Branched alkylphenol and its calcium salt: Effects on liver, adrenals, and reproductive organs were seen in rats with repeated oral doses. Decreased fertility index, decreased number of live pups, and other effects were seen in reproductive studies in rats dosed orally. Time to sexual maturation and weights of the uterus and ovaries were decreased in young female rats dosed orally.
